A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am going to talk about myself a little bit. Some of you may be wondering what is going on with the effort towards getting my doctorate. The truth is that the effort is still going on! Also a new feature in the pipe organ was given in honor of the choir and all church music makers. The gift was given anonymously. This new feature, when it is installed, will allow Charles to shut off all the sounds on the organ by pushing one button. It is called a "General Cancel" and is something that organist Charles Harris has been wanting for years. With this button Charles will be able to more quickly change the organ sounds between his Offertory music and the Doxology, or from leading the congregation in song at the end of the service to playing his postlude. Once it is installed, I am sure Charles will be very glad to show you how it works.

That's all I have to talk about right now. Please stay healthy during this flu season by washing your hands frequently and by using the hand sanitizer bottles or dispensers in the sanctuary before worship.

Dear Friends at First Presbyterian in Roanoke Rapids,





March 4th, at 7:00 pm and is Spring Gardening by Victoria Neff of Halifax County Extension Service.




