A few questions and answers to think about:

What is Consecration Sunday?



Consecration Sunday asks people to grow spiritually by giving a percentage of their income to the Lord's work through their congregation. Consecration Sunday helps us refocus our thinking from "how much is necessary to support the budget" to "what percentage of our income is God calling us to give?"

Why do we take this approach to stewardship?

The act of discerning God's will in our giving can be educational and transformational. We have an opportunity to learn that all we have is from God, and we return to God in our giving, thereby extending Christ's transforming love to others.

What is Stewardship?

Christian stewardship is a transformational way of living, understanding that God is the source of all life, and that we are entrusted as stewards of God's world. It rests on the belief that an abundant and generous God provides us with all that we truly need.

Why is my Estimate of Giving important to our church?

Your signature on an Estimate of Giving card allows the church to meet its financial obligations to carry out our mission.

How much should I pledge?

That is between you and God! Scripture calls for 10% of your time, treasure, and talents in support of the church. That is called tithing. Many have made a commitment to work toward tithing by starting with a percentage they felt manageable, and increasing it annually. These annual steps forward are a huge part of our escape from the confines of finances, and toward the focus on God.

May I make my pledge payment directly from my bank, electronically?

Yes, and please do! Many set up automatic payments from their bank account directly to the church. Ask for help from your bank if you don't know how to arrange this. It is a real time saver!

What does my pledge pay for?

Just about everything the church does. But before the church spends any of the money you pledge, the session makes sure that 10 per cent of all expected receipts are devoted to a combination of local and international outreach ministries. It also pays for salaries of the pastor and church staff. It keeps the church buildings maintained and operating. It pays for educational opportunities for youth and adults. Your pledge is a statement of your faith. The session of the church is mindful of this and does its best to approve a budget which puts the money you entrust to the church to the purpose that best befits God's will.
