## PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION

#### SCRIPTURE READING

Jeremiah 29:1-14

These are the words of the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the remaining elders among the exiles, and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people, whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon. This was after King Jeconiah, and the queen mother, the court officials, the leaders of Judah and Jerusalem, the artisans, and the smiths had departed from Jerusalem. The letter was sent by the hand of Elasah son of Shaphan and Gemariah son of Hilkiah, whom King Zedekiah of Judah sent to Babylon to King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon. It said: Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare. For thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Do not let the prophets and the diviners who are among you deceive you, and do not listen to the dreams that they dream, for it is a lie that they are prophesying to you in my name; I did not send them, savs the Lord. For thus says the Lord: Only when Babylon's seventy years are completed will I visit you, and I will fulfil to you my promise and bring you back to this place. For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, I will let you find me, says the Lord, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the

places where I have driven you, says the Lord, and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile.

## What has been collected and spent as of March 31, 2020

Explanation: This is a listing of what has been budgeted for the year in the way of income and expenses for the church. Looking at the rightmost column, you can see that we are \$6622.75 below projected income for the first three months of the year. April already shows to be a better month and we hope that will continue as you get caught up with your pledges. Expenses are pretty close to on target with us spending about \$823 more than what was budgeted for the first three months of the year. The bottom row shows that we have spent more than we have taken in for the first three months of the year. This does not mean the church's checking account is overdrawn. In the checking account is money that was given last year to pay what people pledged for this year. This provides a buffer in the first part of the year for when we have low income. As the year progresses that buffer money will be less and less and we will rely more on people being more timely with their pledged offerings. Hopefully, at the same time the church's frugality will keep expenses below what we take in for offerings.
