A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I want to take up a little space in my note to you to thank you for helping me celebrate my birthday. Having never done it before, I don't know what turning 60 is like. But I am heartened by the fact that I have friends who have done it before, are surrounding me with support, and model the golden years with such gusto and grace.

I also want to talk a little bit about my stepfather, Mike Starling. He lives in West Virginia with my mother. He married my mother when I was seven years old while we lived in Silver Spring, Maryland. It was not long after that, that he decided he would pursue a Ph.D. in Chemistry at Virginia Tech. So we moved to Blacksburg and discovered what life was like in a rural town.

My stepfather was a chemist by training but his research put him squarely in the middle of the growth industry of the time, which was microcomputers. When my stepfather was in grad school many of the things we take for granted in computers did not even exist. Disk drives either floppy or hard were exotic forms of data storage. Much of his work was getting these new technologies to work with the computers that were coming into existence at the time. He was riding, and indeed pushing, the cutting edge of technology.

I was really too young at the time to fully understand all that he was doing, but that didn't keep him from talking to me about what he was doing or answering questions. Towards the end of my time in college, the things I was exposed to while my stepfather worked on his Ph.D. started to gel. I found myself able to write programs and help other students with their programs. While I was interested in doing other things, that exposure to computer technology allowed me to feel comfortable with technology and gave me an entree to my own career in computer programming.

After completing his Ph.D., in 1979 my stepfather took a job at Union Carbide in South Charleston, West Virginia. We moved to a small town on the outskirts of the capital city of Charleston, we purchased a 72-acre plot of

land with a 3-bedroom solar house on it. My mother and stepfather live there to this day.


My stepfather retired when Union Carbide was bought and he was confronted with the thought of moving. My parents decided that they liked where they lived enough to stay and continue the life that they enjoyed regardless of what was happening in the chemical industry. Since then my stepfather has become a maker of things. He has made knives, worked on kit cars, and done more amazing projects than I can keep track of. Some of you saw the video I made of a tiller I converted to electric power. I am not sure I would ever have taken on such a project if I didn't have my stepfather as an influence in my life.

Last Friday my brother Rich called me to tell me that my stepfather was taken to the hospital. He was having a heart attack from a significant amount of fluid that accumulated in his chest. I don't remember him ever going to a doctor. But now he was in need of some serious medical attention.

That's all I know right now. The fluid has been removed from his chest and he is feeling better. But there are ominous signs that tell me much more medical attention will be necessary. Please pray for him and my mother Bonnie Starling.
