A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I have some news that I think you will appreciate. First, I want to tell you that the repair work on the Loy Building has finally started. Having worked in construction, I can tell you that the tradesmen involved are doing very good work. I don't have any idea as to when it will all be completed, but I suspect that the interior will be done sooner than the exterior brick work.

"How is this being paid for?" you may ask. Well, we first made a claim on the insurance of the person who was responsible for the damage (I will talk about that person later). Unfortunately, that insurance company and the contractor we were planning on using couldn't come to an agreement on the cost of the repairs. So we then made a claim with our own insurance. The insurance adjuster contacted our contractor (whose name is Bennie Garner) and they soon came to a mutually agreeable cost to effect the repairs. We were not charged a deductible for making a claim and received the claim check a few weeks ago. Our insurance will approach the insurance company of the vehicle owner to get compensated for the claim payment. If you want to know more details I will be glad to share them in a phone call or after worship one Sunday.

The person responsible for the accident is a friend of the church. Her name is Nancy Floyd. She lives across Roanoke Avenue from the church. The accident was a result of her getting out of her car in her driveway and not getting the transmission all the way into "Park." The vehicle (a Suburban) rolled down her driveway across Roanoke Avenue at about 5:15 pm, jumped the curb, avoided a tree and struck the Loy Building about three feet to the left of the doorway. I don't think there has been a time when I called her about where things were with the claim that she hasn't apologized over and over again for what happened. I think the best thing we can do for Nancy is reach out to her and assure her that none of us bear any bad will towards her.

Another bit of news is that I have just completed my first semester on my Master's degree at UNC-Greensboro. I only took one class, which was Intermediate Statistics. In the spring I intend to take the next level of that course, which is geared towards designing experiments in the field of education. I am hopeful that sometime in the future, maybe the fall of next year, I will be able to take 2 or 3 classes. I love school but I also have some plans to use this degree too!

I also want to tell you that it is quite possible that we will be putting new roofs on at least two of our buildings. It is too early to tell you all the details because they are not quite firm, but I can tell you that we will be getting some help from an insurance claim we made. The claim involves some wind damage we have sustained.

The best news that I have is that we are now in Advent! It is that special time of the year that we plan for the coming of Christ, not as a baby (He has already done that), but as our king who will come to claim this world for his kingdom. This calls for us to prepare and wait. Preparing means thinking that he will arrive soon. Waiting means staying vigilant for his arrival even when he doesn't come when we expect. What should we do to prepare? Come to worship the next four Sundays and I'll bet you'll come away with some ideas.

In the meantime, I wish you every happiness this Advent and Christmas season. It will be a special time for me because I get to share it with you!






